FLYING BAMBOO

INSTALLATION

In 2012 Trimukhi Platform opened the question: "What does "to build" mean?". From an initial drawing, a barely visible trace on the ground, a different architecture has taken place which contains the actual movement from different geopolitical centres (Paris, London, Kolkata or Mexico) to a single border (Borotalpada): a cultural centre outside the centre. Such a *sui-generis* project literally condenses the lines which provide the creative structure for the installation that the Mexican visual artist Alejandro Orozco has decided to build: a huge structure mostly made of local bamboo. This *in-situ* installation, developed in collaboration with local villagers presents a space to transit, to stand for a moment, to surround and to visually participate in.
